FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome to a new term and another exciting ten weeks of learning. We welcome several new students to the school and look forward to a busy term as we prepare for the Big Day Out on Saturday 9 September.

This week our Prep students will celebrate 100 days of Prep. Each class will be doing their own little celebration as we celebrate how much our young Prep children have grown and learnt in their first 100 days of school.

This week we welcome our new teachers to the school. Please welcome to 3A permanent staff member Ms Megan Cutler, to 4D Ms Alexis Forbes and to 6C Ms Carmel Flemming. We also welcome some wonderful relief teachers for those staff on extended leave including Ms Julie Chapman on 2D till Friday 21 July; Ms Chris Vanderwolf on 3B until Friday 14 July; Ms Jessica Chia will be teaching 4A until Wednesday 19 July. We also welcome Ms Jill Holloway on 2C as Ms Fallon Cappler was involved in a motor vehicle accident during the holidays and due to injury is unable to return to work for the first two weeks.

During the holidays we commenced some of the major works being undertaken to improve the school facilities. This is part of a long-term facilities upgrade and included the completion of the installation of the pool filtration system and secure store areas, major garden maintenance works, painting of the office entrance, repairs to the roof in Prep classrooms, check and installation of additional external lighting especially around the perimeter of the hall, and general cleaning.

We have also been advised that the kerb and channel is being replaced in Pringle Street. This work was due to be completed in the holidays but was delayed due to the weather. Thank you to all parents for your patience and understanding as we endeavour to improve our school learning environment.

School Vision and Focus

One of the benefits of an education at Ascot State School is the breadth of programs available for our students. This term our teams continue with Debating and Optiminds. We also have selected students participating in the Mini-Thinkers Program that commences this Wednesday for three weeks. Years 3 & 4 students are joining other students from City Cluster schools for enrichment as Writers, Scientists, Design Thinkers or Coders. We welcome students from other schools attending Ascot State School over the next three Wednesdays to participate in the Design Thinkers class with Ms Atkins and Mr Marsh.

We also continue with our choral groups, band and ensembles. New students are welcome to join the choral groups with the Junior Choir held on Friday mornings from 8.15am in the hall. All students in Years 1 and 2 are welcome to join. The Senior Choir is on Mondays from 1.15pm in the hall and all students from Years 3 to 6 are invited to join. We welcome newcomers this term, but ask that students are committed and attend rehearsals every week.

Also we commence our Footsteps Dance classes this semester. Prep-Year 2 students commence this term and Years 3 to 6 in term four. Within The Arts Curriculum, our Artist in Residence, Anuska de Luca, continues working with the Years 3 and 5 classes and then Prep students in Week 3. Our very popular lunch time Art Clubs continue also.

In Week 4, our Year 6 students are off to Canberra for the week. There will be a Parent Information Session on the Canberra Trip on Wednesday 19 July at 6.30pm in the staff room before the P&C meeting.

School and Community Partnerships

This Friday we have a Class Parent Rep Meeting in the staff room from 9.00-9.30am. As we are in full swing for the Big Day Out it will be great to have as many Class Parent Reps attend as possible.

PAYMENT PROCESS CHANGE – INCURSIONS, EXCURSIONS & CAMPS

The school will no longer issue Term Accounts. Instead events will be invoiced individually.

As the school is required to pay for events in advance, it is necessary to enforce a cut of date for payments. **NO LATE PAYMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

ABSENCES

The safety of children is paramount.

This is why the school needs to know your child's whereabouts during the school day.

For Prep, students arrive to class at 8.35am to commence learning at 8.45am when the roll is first marked.

Students in Years 1-6 should arrive to class at 8.50am to prepare to start the school day at 9.00am when the roll is first marked.

The student absence phone line is **33269326**. This is a 24/7 recorded message service.

Daily absence

If your child will be absent from school parents must phone the absence phone line before 9.00am. Message should include day, caller's name, student's name, class, and reason for absence. The teacher will be notified of the student's absence by office staff.

Parents are asked to follow this procedure any time your child is absent from Ascot State School, including attending an off campus activity arranged through the school. For example City District/Met North Sport, Chess Tournaments, Music Camps, etc.

If your child will be absent from school for more than one day, call the absence phone line in advance. Message should include caller's name, student's name, class, reason for absence and duration of absence. The teacher will be notified of the student's absence by office staff.

Absences of more than 10 consecutive school days duration require Principal approval. Forms are available from the office. This allows the school to record the absence as an exemption – meaning it is a non-penalty absence.

Late Arrivals

If your child will arrive to class **after roll call at 9.00am** parents must phone the absence phone line before 9.00am. Message should include day, caller's name, student's name, class and reason for delay. On arrival students must go directly to the office where a Late Slip is issued for the student to give to their teacher on arrival to class.

Early departures

Parents should present to office to collect your child. Office staff will arrange for your child to come to Office for collection and issue an early departure slip that will be given to the class

teacher by office staff. Staff will not permit any child to be collected from the classroom or play areas.

Unexplained absences

Should your child's absence be unexplained an automated SMS will be sent. A prompt response is requested.

Important note: Advising the teacher in person or via email does not negate the need to follow the above procedures and may result in inaccurate attendance records.

For your information the roll is called again at 2.00pm. School finishes at 3.00pm (Prep at 2.45pm) and children should be collected promptly.

Before School, After School and Vacation Care are provided by Camp Australia at Barlow Street, Clayfield. Enquiries to 1300 105 343.

Your child's safety is a joint responsibility requiring good communication between home and school.
