## From the Principal

#### **Dear Ascot Families**

A sincere thanks to Rebecca, the Year 5 parent volunteers, sponsors and P&C for the organisation of the Colour Run. It was enjoyed by all students and I hope that it was just as successful as a fundraiser as it was a fun afternoon. To the staff who volunteered to be slimed – thank you.



#### Primary Principal's Conference

Once a year the Queensland Association of State School Primary Principals host a conference which is attend by over 400 delegates. International speakers present their research and there are many opportunities to share best practice. This year the theme was The Joyful Sandbox, hence the visitors to the school with an interest in play. We were addressed by Beau Lotto, a neuroscientist and entrepreneur. His key message was about adapting to change because the only constant in life is change. He spoke about trading certainty for doubt that helps increase our capacity to adapt, lead and innovate. Dan Haesler, a culture champion, works with leaders in all fields as well as elite sporting personnel. His message was based on creating safe learning cultures where mistakes are a part of growth and ultimately lead to better outcomes. I enjoyed the presentation from Zoe Smith, a principal who spoke about inquiry through leadership lens.

We listen, we learn, we act – there is no particular order. Prioritising and understanding context also factors into the equation. For Ascot, we know that our work in intentional based learning, inquiry and investigation is the way forward in engaging students in their education.

#### Visitors to the School

Last week we had the principals from the City Collective visit our school. As a group of primary and high schools, we meet each month in a different school. It gives us an opportunity to visit each other's schools, share the great experiences and also coordinate the multitude of cluster events. At Ascot, we are deliberate in our use of Loose Parts and Nature Play as a space for children to relax, enjoy and also learn. The Preps were building bridges and our curious visitors were able to talk to the young learners about their experiences.



On Wednesday 10 May a tour was organised by the Primary Principal's Association for leaders to visit Eagleby South as well as Ascot for the purpose of viewing how Nature Play and Loose Parts looks in different schools. Schools endeavour to balance the traditional methods of instruction with student centred learning and investigations.

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning

The focus for the week is: <u>I am responsible</u>. *I lead by demonstrating good sportsmanship*. This is an important message as we have Gala Days and sports carnivals on the calendar. Being a good sport includes:

- Accepting umpire decisions
- Playing fairly and choosing fair teams
- Respecting and acknowledging the opposition
- Encouraging others
- Display positive winning/losing skills
- Uniform requirements for events

#### Communication

Communication is a tricky subject and what is too much for one is not enough for others. We endeavour to communicate in a timely way through the school's fortnightly newsletter, The Digest, the school calendar on the website and the fortnightly newsletter from the classrooms. These are points of truth. There are also emails sent to year levels or groups as per need eg. the choir or cross country team.

#### ICAS Competition for 2023 - Years 3-6

#### What is ICAS?

ICAS is an online academic competition that is designed to assess students' higher order thinking and problem-solving skills. At Ascot, we offer families in Years 3-6 the opportunity to sit the competition in English and Maths. We also select students on the basis of their academic performance to sit the ICAS Science competition.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition and development. Every student who participates will receive a printed certificate and an online results report. Top performers will be eligible for medals.

#### How to participate in ICAS

Parents can elect to have their child/ren participate, and must sign up before 31 July. At this point, the payment portal closes, and no further entries can be taken. The cost of each competition is \$19.50.





#### Year 6 Binary Code - Pixel Art

In Digital Technologies, Year 6 students are exploring how computers store and send digital images. Students have developed their understanding of binary numbers, including:

- why binary numbers are important in digital systems
- how to read and understand a binary number.

Students applied their knowledge about how binary is used to create their own pixel art. Check out some of the work from Ms Butler's 6B students!



Year 6 will now begin exploring using our school drones. They will be programming and flying these drones to perform various flight missions. We look forward to sharing this work over the coming weeks.

### Year 3 Science - Biological Science

Last week, Year 3 were treated to a visit from Street Science.

Street Science captivated our young scientists, by engaging them in fun and meaningful hands-on workshops. Students were able to demonstrate, explore and explain scientific concepts such as:

- Properties of living things
- Sorting objects into living and non-living
- Viewing once-living and living things under a microscope
- States of matter and how they change
- How adding or removing heat can change object

In Term 4, during Education Week we will welcome Street Science back to Ascot to work with our P-4 students during our annual STEAM Week.

Thank you to 3A and 3C for sharing the below photos and a recount of their experience.

When Street Science came to our school, we learned about changing states of matter and classifying living and non-living things using Mrs Gren (movement, respiration, sensitivity, growth, reproduction, excretion and nutrition).

The mad microscopes helped us observe living and non-living things up close.

We used liquid nitrogen so we could learn more about states of matter. The scientist used a heat pen, so when she heated up some writing the ink disappeared. It was so much fun.
